Seniors, 65 and older, did you know that you can go to a Kentucky College for free tuition?

KRS.154.284 Waiver of tuition and fees for sixty-five and older—Conditions.

1. When any person sixty-five of age older, who is a resident of the Commonwealth, is admitted and enrolls as a student in any state-supported institution of higher learning in this Commonwealth, the board of trustees of the institution or other appropriate instituting official's hall waive all tuition charge and fee for such student, except as provided in subsection (2) of this section.

SOLICITATION

At the present time, there are no permits for solicitors on file at City Hall. Lately, City Hall has received calls from residents reporting solicitors in certain areas of the City. You are correct to call City Hall and we encourage you to ask the solicitor to show you their Metro Permit and Douglass Hill's permit. A Metro permit does not give them permission to be in the City. Even though you may encounter a nice person soliciting, they are required to apply at City Hall to be in compliance with the City's ordinances.

Please remember that signs are permitted in Douglass Hills, but they need to be taken down following the event. Posted signs are not permitted on the street signs, light posts or City announcement boards. They will be removed immediately if your signs are posted in these restricted areas. DEADLINE IS EXTENDED TO REGISTER RENTAL PROPERTIES

The deadline to register rental properties is now April 3rd under a recently passed ordinance by Louisville Metro Council. The initial deadline had been March 1st. Louisville is initiating this registry to know a contact in case there is a maintenance issue or complaint on the property.
