MINUTES Council Meeting—February 6, 2020 Page 1

A Council meeting of the Douglass Hills City Council was called to order by Mayor Bonnie Jung at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, November 7, 2019 at City Hall. Members of the Council in attendance were Bill Middleton, Matthew Nelson, Jeff Riddle, Denise Scarpellini, Patti Eubanks and Neil Sandefur, City Clerk Clay Porter, City Treasurer Holly Sanford and City Attorney John Singler were also in attendance.

Mayor Jung led the Council and those present in THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG.

POLICE REPORT

Officer Darrell Spurgeon, of Off-Duty Police Services, was absent from the meeting. Mayor Jung notified Officer Spurgeon in regard to parking problems on Gatehouse Lane when Crosby Middle releases in the afternoons.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes of the January 8, 2019 Council meeting were put on the table. Mr. Middleton made a motion to accept the minutes; seconded by Mr. Sandefur. The motion passed unanimously 5-0. Mrs. Scarpellini abstained from the vote.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. Riddle moved to accept the December 2019 Treasurer's report; seconded by Mrs. Scarpellini. The motion passed unanimously 6-0.

MAYOR JUNG'S REPORT

- Mayor Bonnie Jung stated that the Limestone Bank investment was closed to help pay for the swim pool project. The investment amount was \$256,000.

- Jeff Miller Landscaping will be getting the City of Douglass Hills an estimate to grade and seed the Farmingham Road Tree Project.
- Mayor Bonnie Jung spoke about the swimming pool rehabilitation. She stated that the decking and concrete portion is ninety percent complete at this time. Mayor Jung also spoke about the retaining wall between the baby pool and tennis courts. This wall will need to be replaced at a cost of about \$9,000. Also, the new Tuff Shed is complete other than a concrete driveway and landscaping. There was much discussion about the slide remaining at the pool. Mayor Bonnie Jung stated that she was getting bids to paint and/or rebuild slide with new colors.
- Mayor Bonnie Jung spoke about a crossing guards meeting she attended recently. She was told the cost if the crossing guards at Crosby Middle school would be \$18,000 to Douglass Hills. Councilperson Piagentini stated that it is not a money. It's an issue of mismanagement and staffing with Louisville Metro.
- Mayor Jung stated that Kentucky League of Cities is supporting legislation that would change the laws regarding publication in newspapers for public notice. The monetary amounts have become too costly for smaller cities.
- Café Louie will be on January 18, 2020 @9am.
- 65th Annual Jefferson County League of Cities is on February 20, 2020 @7pm in the Tway House.
- Mayor Jung stated that she met with councilperson Tony Piagentini. He pledged \$40,000 for sidewalks on Tattenham Lane. Douglass Hills will have to use \$2,000 to paint pickleball courts. Douglass Hills is trying to obtain a grant from KIPDA for another portion of money for the Tattenham Lane sidewalk project.
- The Rubber Dollar letter allows a salary adjustment of 2.3% for staff, mayor and council members.
- The new Public Works employee Scott Blevins has a new email dhpublicworks@gmail.com
- Mayor Jung spoke to Libs Paving Company about repaving a couple of streets this year. If cost is under \$30,000 no bid is required by law.

OLD BUSINESS- -NONE


