We were saddened to hear that 2 of our former Mayors passed within days of each other. These men were tremendous public servants who continued to give back to the community long after their terms as councilmen and Mayor were finished.

From both men I learned so much, but most of all, just by their actions I learned what it meant to give back without hesitation. I learned that passion cannot be hidden and that who you are is seen by actions and not always words. I am grateful for their stewardship, leadership, and commitment to the citizens of Douglass Hills.

Mayor Sherl Fetter, served on the council from 1986-2004 and was elected Mayor in 2004 and served until 2008. While his daughter Leigh Ann coached our Hurricanes swim team, I never went to a swim meet where I did not see him on the sideline cheering as loudly as the coaches. He was a staple for the team and our community.

Mayor Fetter is preceded in death by his wife of 50 years, Rose. He is survived by his children Denise, Bruce, Michael and Leigh Ann and their families.

Mayor Warren Walker was appointed to serve on the council in 1990 to serve out a prior term and in that same year, was elected Mayor. Mayor Walker served 14 years as Mayor from 1990-2004. Mayor Walker was instrumental in the development of our parks and old playground.

He served on the Jefferson County League of Cities Board of Directors and as past president, and in 2003 was awarded the JCLC Peyton Hoge III Public Service Award.

Mayor Walker is preceded by his wife Lu and is survived by his children Jeff and Patti. In lieu of flowers, expressions of sympathy can be donated to the Metro United Way or the Red Cross.

# "Branching Out" from the Douglass Hills Tree Committee

Do you want an Elm tree that is resistant to Dutch Elm Disease or Japanese Beetles? Are you looking for a tree that can survive in multiple

soil types or even restricted soil spaces? Look for an Allee Elm—a fast growing tree that can grow up to 80 feet tall! The glossy green foliage turns yellow in the fall and has even been known to go a pinkish red in some years. The bark is silver-gray and its deep folds grow parallel and vertically from the ground to the crown of the tree. But the most interesting aspect of the bark is that it exfoliates.

As it peels shades of gray, green, brown and orange patterns appear. Once established, it's also a tough tree withstanding urban situations, drought, and high winds. The Allee is a good tree offering abundant shade when planted by streets, driveways, or near a home.



#### **Accepted Items:**

- Up to 3 electronic items (recycled)
- Metal & appliances no refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers or any items containing Freon (recycled)
- Up to 4 passenger tires (recycled)
- Household recyclables, follow curbside rules (recycled)
- Yard waste, follow curbside rules, wooden pallets (composted)
- Large household items (landfilled)
- Documents for shredding (recycled)
- Prescription medication (disposed properly)

Items must already be separated into categories for easy offloading so as much can be recycled as possible.

#### **Not Accepted:**

- Garbage, loose debris (use curbside garbage collection or take to landfill)
- Concrete, bricks, rocks
- Construction debris (take to Waste Reduction Center, fees apply)
- Refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, or items containing Freon (take to Waste Reduction Center or metal recycling facility)
- Latex paint (disposal information)
- Batteries, light bulbs, oil-based paint, varnishes, stains, and other household hazardous waste (take to Haz Bin)
- Tree trunks
- Boats, hot tubs
- Items from businesses
- Trailers greater than 10 feet in length (larger loads can be taken to the Waste Reduction Center)

#### **WASTE TIRE COLLECTION EVENT**




