MINUTES Council Meeting October 5, 2023, Page 1

A Council meeting of the Douglass Hills City Council was called to order by Mayor Bonnie Jung at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 5, 2023. Members of the Council in attendance were Denise Scarpellini, Matthew Nelson, Jeff Riddle, Bill, Middleton, Patti Eubanks, City Clerk Clay Porter, City Treasurer Holly Sanford, City Attorney John Singler, were also in attendance. Neil Sandefur was absent from the meeting.

OFF DUTY POLICE- Mr. Darrell Spurgeon reported that an abandoned truck in Warren Walker Park was in fact owned by a Douglass Hills citizen. Mr. Spurgeon stated that there will be additional patrols for Douglass Hills 50<sup>th</sup> birthday party and Halloween.

# APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes of the September 7, 2023, City Council meeting were put on the table. Mr. Middleton made a motion to accept the minutes; Mrs. Scarpellini seconded by. The motion passed 5-0.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. Riddle moved to accept the August 2023 Treasurer's report; seconded by Mr. Nelson. The motion passed unanimously 5-0.

<u>PUBLIC WORKS REPORT</u> Mr. Burke Davis reported that Public Works was busy this month with the Fall Farmers Market, Crosby Color Run, and Whisper Walk. Public Works has been trimming limbs that are hanging over sidewalks. Mr. Davis has been working with Mr. Riddle to get a mowing bid together for next year. Also, Public Works is pricing irrigation systems for the city.

### **GUEST SPEAKERS-NONE**

<u>SAFETY COMMITTEE</u>- Mr. Jerry McGraw stated that the Safety Committee discussed having the speed sign refurbished. Mr. McGraw stated that the Safety Committee had a complaint about speeding on Berry Hill Road. The Safety Committee discussed adding LG&E light poles and dead-end signs around several places around the city. The Safety Committee discussed a citizen request about repainting crosswalks and stop bars around the city.

TREE COMMITTEE- Morgan Herdon reported that the Tree Committee will be replacing two trees with Canadian Hemlock in November behind 11103 Finchley Road that the city accidentally cut down while clearing the ditch line.

**EVENT COORDINTOR**- Jennie Norfleet reported to the City Council about upcoming events in Douglass Hills. Douglass Hills 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary will be held on October 7, 2023, from 11:00am to 3:00pm.

<u>PLANNING AND ZONING COMMITTEE-</u> Mr. Jeff Riddle reported that the Planning and Zoning Committee has hired attorney Cliff Ashburner to review Douglass Hills ordinance 80 on building and zoning. Mr. Riddle will be attending a Kentucky League of Cities training session on planning and zoning.

<u>COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS-</u> Mr. Britt Rhodes spoke about safety issues with Douglass Hills not having sidewalks. Mr. Rhodes believes that safety is the number one priority for any city. He encouraged Douglass Hills to spend ARPA money on sidewalks instead of the Public Works Department garage addition. Mr. Rhodes stated that the Enclaves has been working on curbs and sidewalks. Mr. Rhodes asked the City Council if they plan on opening the entrance to the Enclaves on Farmingham Road. Mayor Jung responded that the road opening will be determined once the Enclaves has finished building.
