"Branching Out" from the Tree Committee

The TULIP POPLAR was one of the two trees given away during our Arbor Day Celebration. However, it's not really a poplar, but a member

of the magnolia family. The leaves are key to identifying the tree because they are distinctive and unlike any other tree's leaf—they are described as the shape of a cat's head. A cool factor is that the tree has nearly perfect posture and it self-prunes; so as it grows into maturity the lower branches fall off. The pale yellow to green tulip-shaped flowers bloom from April-June and though it produces multiple seeds, the reseeded germination is low.

A rapid grower reaching 80-120 feet makes it a desirable street or shade tree. It's pyramidal form and resistance to most pests and diseases add to its popularity. Just give it space to grow—it can live for hundreds of years!



NATIONAL PEDESTRIAN SAFETY MONTH

In 2020, October was designated as "National Pedestrian Safety Month." Pedestrian deaths in the U.S. reached a 40-year high in 2023, spurred in part by inadequate infrastructure, such as missing sidewalks or lighting, the rise in popularity of SUVs and pick-up trucks, which tend to strike a person in the head, neck, and chest area, and wide, high-speed arterial roadways separating residential areas from commercial uses.

In a crash involving a vehicle and a pedestrian, the pedestrian is far more likely to be killed or injured. Here are a few safety tips for motorists.

- **1. Slow down.** Vehicle speed and weight greatly determine injury severity, or the level of blunt force trauma a person must endure. Obey the speed limit.
- **2.** Use extra caution when driving at night. National and local statistics show approximately 75% of pedestrian fatalities occur during non-daylight hours.
- **3. Don't run.** Stop and render aid if you hit someone.

Call 911 immediately. National and local statistics show approximately 25% of pedestrian fatalities are hit-andrun. Visit StopTheBleed.org to learn techniques to reduce blood loss after injury.

Earlier this year, Louisville Metro Public Works and the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) released a new report on pedestrian safety in Louisville. Prepared by Palmer Engineering and HDR, the report finds that fatal and suspected serious injury crashes have increased over the past decade, mirroring a national trend in the U.S.

The report includes four lists of intersections recommended for pedestrian safety improvements. Of the 176 total unique intersections, 85% are included in Louisville's High Injury Network. A High Injury Network is a data-driven approach which identifies non-interstate roadway segments that account for a disproportionate amount of a community's fatal and serious injury crashes. The High Injury Network allows communities to focus limited resources on improving safety along high priority corridors.






